

Pastor's Pondering Pastor Jean M. Hansen

As we begin a new year, it seemed like a good time to be reminded that Faith Lutheran Church, while an individual congregation, is also a part of the Evangelical Church in America (ELCA) which was formed the year I was ordained, 1988, following a merger of three Lutheran bodies, the American Lutheran Church, the Association of Evangelical Lutheran Churches and the Lutheran Church in America. At the end of 2023 there were 8,498 congregations in the ELCA and approximately 2.8 million members.

Our congregation is in the **Northeastern Ohio Synod (NEOS)**, which is one of 65 synods that vary greatly in size, geography, membership, staffing and program. There are approximately 140 congregations in the NEOS.

The **Rev. Dr. Laura Barbins** is our Synod's Bishop; she was elected to that role in 2020. The **Rev. Mitch Phillips** is the Assistant to the Bishop. He and his wife Charisse are members of our congregation. **Pastor Jonathan Stufft** is the Assistant to the Bishop for Congregational Vitality & Director for Evangelical Mission. **Deacon Jennifer Frantz** is the Director of Communication and Formation (youth & young adult ministry, coordination of the candidacy program, and coordination of the Lay Leadership School "Growing in Faith"). Four other individuals make up the NEOS Support Staff. All of them work out of the Synod Office (Lutheran Center) in Cuyahoga Falls.

Each year, Faith Lutheran Church strives to give approximately 10 percent of its operating fund receipts to the Northeastern Ohio Synod as **Mission Support**. In 2025 that amount will be \$59,000. Mission Support from congregations is the primary source of income for the NEOS. According to the NEOS website, approximately 50 percent of those funds are passed on to the churchwide (national) expression of the church. In addition, 25 percent supports rostered leaders, 14 percent is used in the area of congregational vitality and 11 percent for youth and young adult ministry, all in the Northeastern Ohio Synod.

Our congregation's relationship with the Synod is an interdependent one; our constitution spells out what that mutual relationship involves. It also details the significant ways that we are an independent entity. To put it simply, neither the Synod nor the Churchwide organization can tell a congregation what to do as long as it is following its own constitution and by-laws, which have been approved by the Synod and, thus, are in agreement with the governing documents of the ELCA.

So, congregations call pastors and deacons, approve budgets, acquire or dispose of property, amend their constitution and by-laws, all according to the guidelines in their governing documents and with congregational approval. The Synod leadership cannot "require" a congregation to close, to merge, to move, or do much else. The Synod staff does provide guidance and encourages acting in accordance with the purposes of and governing documents of the ELCA.

We are, to a large degree, a democratic organization in which the members of the church, or their representatives on the Church Council, make the decisions (as long as they choose to participate.)

I am thankful to be a part of the ELCA, and the Northeastern Ohio Synod so that our ministry together will fulfill the vision and purpose of the ELCA.

**Vision**: A world experiencing the difference God's grace and love in Christ make for all people and creation.

**Purpose**: Activate each of us so more people know the way of Jesus and discover community, justice and love.

## LOADS OF FAITH (LoF)

We are most delighted that our grant application to the Akron Community Foundation has been approved. We received the following notification:

Congratulations! Based on the recommendations from our Community Investment Committee, the Akron Community Foundation Board has approved a grant of \$1,500.00 from the Community Fund - Health & Human Services for Loads of Faith - a Laundry Love Ministry ... to cover the cost of laundromat services for low/no income Summit County residents in Akron.

Although the amount is less than we requested, the approval points to two very significant elements. The first is community recognition of our ministry's importance. Please understand that not all proposals submitted were funded. So ours was selected over other worthwhile causes that were not funded. Second, it places us in a position for future funding possibilities and credibility within the local philanthropic community network. Congratulations and thanks to Dana Singer who prepared the proposal and shepherded it with Pastor Jean's support and participation through the rigorous review process.

## MITZVAH DAYS 2025

The first Mitzvah Days committee meeting for 2025 took place on December 11, at Temple Israel. Thanks to Loralee Daily for attending this meeting on our behalf. Art Krakauer, project coordinator, reported that ten of the nineteen projects from last year will be repeated. He also shared that the youth crisis intervention program, Safe Landing, will be included for a project this year. New Mitzvah Day congregations joining this year are Green Valley United Methodist Church and New Covenant Church. This year's program will take place on June 7 and 8.

#### **AKRON AREA INTERFAITH COUNCIL (AAIC)**

The AAIC's December meeting was hosted by WISH (Women Interfaith Spiritual Heritage) at the Alpha Phi Alpha Homes building on Wolf Ledges Parkway. Both Bob Radl and David Simpson attended representing Faith Lutheran Church.

One project discussed was advocacy regarding House Bill 445 and Senate Bill 29 which relate to Public School Release Time for Religious instruction. There is an effort to change the bill's wording from "require" to "permit" school boards to adopt a policy authorizing students to attend a released time course in religious instruction conducted by a private entity off school district property during regular school hours. This bill is being promoted largely by a single religious nonprofit that is known for its extremist ideology and connections with Project 2025, with the goal "to reach unchurched public school students with the gospel." AAIC members were also urged to support elimination of the death penalty in Ohio which is also under discussion in the legislature.

Bob Radl shared the following announcement at the meeting:

A celebration by the Magar Society of Ohio, USA will be in early January 2025. The festival will be at the Royal Palace, 134 East Tallmadge Avenue, Akron, and will run all day. Maghe Sankranti, is a Nepali festival observed on the first Maghe in the Vikram Sambat, or Yele calendar, marking the end of the winter solstice and the month of Poush. It will include much singing and dancing. Food will be served. The exact date will be announced later. You may ask Bob for more information.

The next AAIC meeting will be on January 7, at noon, at Mustard Seed in Highland Square.

#### WISH (Women Interfaith Spiritual Heritage) PROJECT ANNOUNCEMENT

The project is named Interweaving Sacred Prayers Collaborative. It will invite members of all faith communities to participate in the development of handwoven tapestries which will symbolically represent their faith. WISH will facilitate sessions that will allow individuals to connect and collaborate on the creation of the tapestry. The process will use art and creative endeavor to produce an object that will exemplify how our community works to build relationships and understanding. The finished product(s) will be available for display throughout the community at venues to be determined later. Project initiation date will be announced in early 2025.

In our tradition, we embrace the idea that God's love is everpresent, guiding us not only in times of joy but also through moments of uncertainty. The new year invites us to practice hope,

gratitude, and a renewed sense of purpose as we step into God's unfolding story.

For families with young children, this season can be a time to cultivate sacred rhythms and practices that nurture faith at home. Here are a few ideas to help your family welcome the new year with intention:

#### 1. Gratitude Jar

### Faith Book Club's January Pick - Dead Wake By Erik Larson

On May 1, 1915, with WWI entering its tenth month, a luxury ocean liner as richly appointed as an English country house sailed out of New York, bound for Liverpool, carrying a record number of children and infants. The passengers were surprisingly at ease, even though Germany had declared the seas around Britain to be a war zone. For months, German U-boats had brought terror to the North Atlantic. But the *Lusitania* was one of the era's great transatlantic "Greyhounds"--the fastest liner then in service--and her captain, William Thomas Turner, placed tremendous faith in the gentlemanly strictures of warfare that for a century had kept civilian ships safe from attack.

Germany, however, was determined to change the rules of the game, and Walther Schwieger, the captain of *Unterseeboot*-20, was happy to oblige. Meanwhile, an ultra-secret British intelligence unit tracked Schwieger's Uboat, but told no one. As U-20 and the *Lusitania* made their way toward Liverpool, an array of forces both grand and achingly small all converged to produce one of the great disasters of history.

It is a story that many of us think we know but don't, and Erik Larson tells it brilliantly Gripping and important, *Dead Wake* captures the sheer drama and emotional power of a disaster whose intimate details and true meaning have long been obscured by history.
