

Pastor's Pondering Pastor Jean M. Hansen

OK...who chose an Advent devotion booklet from a Catholic publishing house to distribute at a Lutheran church for use by its members? I confess; it was me.

The booklet, titled "Emerge into Great Joy" by S. James Meyer contains daily reflections, practices and prayers. When the company called to see if we really wanted it, since it notes observances that are not a part of our tradition - like "The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary" on December 9 or "Our Lady of Guadalupe" on December 12 – I stuck with my first impulse and said "yes".

For one thing, it's good to broaden our knowledge of the faith practice of other Christians. But the real reason I chose this resource is its theme of "emerging". When someone or something emerges, there is movement, revelation, the sense of becoming. The old is left behind, and the new arrives.

So, the booklet's author encourages the reader to emerge into awe, peace, truth, faith, joy, wisdom ... to come out of apathy, turmoil, falsehood, doubt, depression and cynicism ... into a new way of being.

During Advent we are preparing for the birth of Jesus, so that as he emerges into our world our hearts will be ready to receive him. My hope is that by using this devotion booklet each day in Advent, we all will emerge into amazement as we celebrate Jesus' birth. May we join in the author's Christmas Day prayer with transformed hearts:

Brother Jesus, let my heart beat happily, my lungs breathe joyfully, my mind open cheerfully, and my spirit leap exuberantly as I am overwhelmed with amazement at your presence in my life here and now. Amen"

MITZVAH DAYS 2025

Temple Israel's Mitzvah Day Planning Committee will hold its first meeting for the 2025 program on December 11, at 7 p.m. at the Temple. The tentative dates for next year's events are June 7 and 8.

FIRST SERVE

We recently received a note from Sue Wimer and Amy Baldwin, Director and Co-Director of First Serve, letting us know that the organization became a Blue Line Charity for the Akron Marathon Series. From this year's marathon the organization raised \$56,078 which was the largest amount for any participating charity.

NOTE FROM THE AKRON CANTON REGIONAL FOODBANK

"Your Foodbank continues to experience an unprecedented year. We distributed more than 3 million pounds of food each month for the past ten months. The Foodbank and our network of partners have seen a 21% increase in the number of visits from people seeking help with groceries compared to the first half of 2023. Pounds of food distributed are up 19% compared to last year. Thankfully, food donations from most of our food sources are up, too, but our inventory turnover rate is still extremely high, meaning we're distributing food faster than it's coming in. As the demand for groceries remains high, support from our generous community is vital to our ability to feed our neighbors experiencing hardships."

TEMPLE ISRAEL DECISION

On Tuesday, November 11, the board of directors of Temple Israel passed a resolution voicing opposition to Ohio House Bill 445. This legislation would make it mandatory for all school districts in Ohio to allow students to leave during the school day for religious education. Many people feel that this bill is a violation of the US constitution which separates church and state. The Temple's concerns are expressed in the following questions:

- 1. If every minute of the school day is important, then what does this say about the quality of public education in Ohio?
- 2. How should minority students feel if they are left behind when others leave school for this program?
- 3. Is this program designed to proselytize?

The social action committee at Temple Israel will be working on this issue until it is resolved.
