Pastor's Pondering Pastor Jean M. Hansen

I have been overwhelmed in recent days with the news coming from California concerning the horrific fires in the Los Angeles area. USA Today (January 14, 2025) reported that, at that point, at least 24 people have been killed in the fires, according to the Los Angeles medical examiner's office. The wildfires had destroyed or damaged more than 12,000 homes, businesses and other structures. The Pacific Palisades neighborhood had been reduced to rubble; the fire had consumed 23,713 acres.

Amid the statistics are many stories of people facing the challenge with courage and ingenuity. People like George Wilken, 79, in the Pacific Palisades who raced from spot fire to spot fire in his SUV with water to douse the flames. He saved some homes, he said, but hundreds of his longtime neighbors lost theirs. He also was keeping an eye on his church, Palisades Lutheran. At night Wilken said he had been returning to his nearby apartment, but without power or gas service, it was easier to spend his days at the church where he had been clearing debris from the grounds and keeping an eye out for looters. While his church was untouched aside from ash that drifted through the doors, the Palisades Presbyterian church across the street had burned to the ground.

It's difficult to imagine functioning in the midst of such unpredictability and destruction. Yet, people do ... and people often do more than just function ... they take risks to make a positive difference in the situation and help one another by providing physical, spiritual and emotional support in the midst of pain and loss, including their own. It will be decades before Los Angeles recovers from this tragedy, if it ever does, and the people impacted by it will be changed for life. Yet, by the power of the Holy Spirit, positive can be found in the negative, as people like Mr. Wilken do what they can for the sake of others. As someone once said, if you want to see good (God?), look for the helpers.

Please pray for those who are struggling due to these devastating fires but also consider sharing a financial gift to help meet their needs. I recommend doing so through Lutheran Disaster Response. (<u>www.give.elca.org</u>)







INTERFAITH JUSTICE ALLLIANCE -- SAVE THE DATES



On Sunday, January 26, Faith joined with more than 1,109 ELCA communities across the United States and Canada in affirming our commitment to the RIC organization and the on-going work of welcome, inclusion, celebration and advocacy for LGBTQIA+ people in the life of the church, as well as all who are named in the Faith Lutheran Church Welcome Statement. We are thankful for our RIC team members, Em Antal, Joseph Antal, Joe Gardner, Corie Miller, Tom Peyton, Dana Singer and Marilyn Wilson - Team Coordinator. A special thank you to Marilyn and Em who delivered a message at each worship service. An informative slideshow about the RIC team, their events and projects, created by Em Antal, was shown in the Welcome Center.

AKRON AREA INTERFAITH COUNCIL (AAIC)

AAIC has been promoting and participating in a program named "**Training on Immigration Issues for Deportation Defense**" through its Immigration Committee and Projecto Raices. Immigration attorney Farhad Sethna has been leading this effort in conjunction with attorneys from Legal Aide. Also, AAIC has been working, throughout the year, to end the death penalty in the state of Ohio. Surveys demonstrate that most Ohioans believe in ending the death penalty.

Faith Book Club Reads a History-Based Thriller

Faith's book club will meet on **February 18**, to discuss February's book of the month choice, **The Bishop's Pawn** by Steve Berry. The Bishop's Pawn continues renowned New York Times top five bestseller Steve Berry's Cotton Malone series with another riveting, history based thriller.

History notes that the ugly feud between J. Edgar Hoover and Martin Luther King, Jr., marked by years of illegal surveillance and the accumulation of secret files, ended on April 4, 1968 when King was assassinated by James Earl Ray. But that may not have been the case, at least as theorized by author Berry.

In the Berry novel, now, fifty years later, former Justice Department agent, fictional Cotton Malone, must reckon with the truth of what really happened that fateful day in Memphis.

It all turns on an incident from eighteen years ago, when Malone, as a young Navy lawyer, is trying hard not to live up to his burgeoning reputation as a maverick. When Stephanie Nelle, a high-level Justice Department lawyer, enlists him to help with an investigation, he jumps at the opportunity. But he soon discovers that two opposing forces the Justice Department and the FBI—are at war over a rare coin and a cadre of secret files containing explosive revelation about the King assassination, information that could ruin innocent lives and threaten the legacy of the civil rights movement's greatest martyr.

Malone's decision to see it through to the end--from the raucous bars of Mexico, to the clear waters of the Dry Tortugas, and ultimately into the halls of power within Washington D.C. itself--not only changes his own life, but the course of history.

Sound like a good read?! Join members of the book club at **2 p.m. in the Youth Room on February 18**. We assure you there will be a lively discussion, following a discussion guide that is posted on the FLC website (Ministries-Adults-FLC Book Club-Current Study Guide). There's a chair waiting for you.
